4 Decisions released on local SIGMA Plans, 2 accepted, 2 sent back for more work Drought Relief funding – Gov designated 200 million.

DWR Funding Efforts:

Round 2, SGM Implementation Grant Program

- •~\$70M for the construction of projects that support GSP implementation; will begin in 2022
- January Budget
- •\$60M for that support GSP development and implementation in the COD basins
- May Revise
- •\$300M for SGMA implementation, including:

Infrastructure projects to improve water supply, water quality, and/or the reliability of drinking water wells

- -Technical assistance grants to ensure engagement of underrepresented communities
- -Provide underrepresented communities with direct and tangible drinking water quality and supply benefits where analysis and mitigation are needed

Leslie reported on development of a Micro plastics definition, standards and methodology, part of SB1263 –a strategy to protect coastal waters.

David Kimbrough reported on ELAP - new lab accredit labs

Water Resilience Portfolio Implementation: Inter-Basin Water Trading presentation (can forward presentation to anyone that is interested)

Groundwater Policy Principles (Michael Marcus) – Discussion & Vote – a few words changed around climate resiliency issues. It most opposed to any changes to ground water rights, don't want to be forced to electrify their fleets. Policy approved.

Clean Water changes around 401 Cert – Biden repeal of Trump changes

EPA extended the LCRR effective date from March 16, 2021 to June 17, 2021. EPA then opened a 30-day comment period seeking input on extending the effective date further to December 16, 2021 and extending the compliance deadline from January 16, 2024 to September 16, 2024.
