


- Program sequence / schedule status was added to Section 1, Work Performed.
- Engineering team primarily focused on responding to questions and requests for information from the Delta Conveyance Office (DCO) environmental team and developing several technical memoranda for the Central and Eastern Corridors and the Bethany Reservoir Alternative.
- Budget status \$23.5 million approved; \$17.0 million committed.

On September 17, 2021, I attended the SCVEDC & COC 2021 Economic Outlook held in-person at the Santa Clarita Performing Arts Center. The following is summary of the program presentations and key points of interest:

- Welcome and introductions by Holly Schroeder, President and CEO of the Santa Clarita Valley Economic Development Corporation (SCVEDC).
- Panel discussion on experiences and lessons learned during the COVID19 pandemic. Moderator: Todd Stevens, President and CEO of Black Knight Energy. Panelists: Jan Swartz, Group President, Princess Cruises &HA Group; Christian Harris, Senior VP & CEO, Sunkist Growers; Lance Williams, Founder, Chairman and CEO, Williams Homes.
- Address from Dr. Dianne Van Hook, Chancellor, College of the Canyons.
- Keynote presentation from Mark Schniepp, Ph.D., Director, California Economic Forecast, 2021 Forecast for the Santa Clarita Valley.

Key points of Dr. Schniepp's presentation:

- Impact of pandemic on California economy more significant than anticipated.
- Long term changes on how we work will be less than what is being hyped.
- The "Great Resignation" is due to the tight labor market and government intervention.
- Federal subsidies are causing a slowdown of recent momentum.
- There is inflation ahead; highest increase since 1989.
- Total employment in Santa Clarita is still down 8,300 jobs after recovering 9,700 jobs from the low in April of 2020.
- Expectations for 2022 include no more interventions that impeded business activity, variants remain under control of die out, the labor force returns.
- We still need another 1 ½ years to offset the economic trauma of 2020.
- Nothing on the horizon that would derail the current recovery, other than unpredictable public health interventions.
- The way we work at offices or anywhere else is changing, but not that much.

State Legislative Update – Adam Quisneros Bills to ban PFAs in plastic utensils and children's clothing are on the Gov's desk Some funding in bill SB170 for PFAs remediation, but only 30 million – not enough

ACWA Federal Affairs Update - Madeline Voitier, ACWA Biden Admin has rescinded Trump Era Wotus rule, so we are back to the previous rule

Safe Drinking Water Subcommittee – Steve Bigley

PFAS Update – Patrick Versluis, discussed new notification levels and when they may come out. Workshop by oeha on Sept 28th

Micro plastics - Scott Coffin, State Water Board

SB1422 passed in 2018 MIcroplastics are a suite of pollution particles focusing on the ones that tend to be toxic. Bottled water has more micro plastics than tap water. Micro plastics over 10mg are removed with usual water purification methods, but is the smaller microplastics that are more harmful. They don't have enough good studies yet.

sb1263 Jared Voskulh Statewide strategy – focuses on sources, pathways, elimination Risk Assessment Ocean Protection Council

Chrome 6 MCL has not been released and no time table on their website. David Kimball – ELAPP update

Clean Water and Aquatic life Subcommittee - Jeremy Jungreis David Manning, Keenan Foster comment letter on the new general order to make permits for restoration projects easier.

DWR GSP Review process - Steve Anderson 354.28c includes spreading pollution

Southern steelhead listing request from CalTrout – AWCA will write a letter outlining impacts to its member agencies. Not needed because it is already federally listed – will make ground water pumping more difficult. CA listing will add restrictions. 1211 permits, wdrs, npdes, etc.

Dave Pederson Perchlorate – detection level for perchlorate is declining 2ppb (July, 2021), 1ppb in 2024. Maybe for study purposes but also may lead to a lower MCL.
