

WSCP STAGE 2 – WATER WASTE RESTRICTIONS

Restrictions:

- Allowing Runoff
- Washing cars without hose nozzle
- Using water to wash down sidewalks, driveways, and hardscapes
- Irrigating during and within 48 hours of measurable rain (.25 inch)
- Using fountains without recirculating pump
- Watering turf on public medians






WSCP STAGE 2 – WATERING RESTRICTIONS

Restrictions:

- Limits on Watering Days to 3 Day per Week Watering
 - Odd Addresses (M,W,F)
 - Even Addresses (T,Th,Sun)
 - No Watering on Saturdays
- Limits on Watering Station Run Times (Duration)
 - Two 5-minute cycles (10 minutes max)
- Watering Times (Time of Day)
 - Nov-Apr \rightarrow 6 PM to 10 AM
 - May-Oct \rightarrow 8 PM to 9 AM

WSCP STAGE 2 – STAGE 2 DROUGHT BULLETIN



DROUGHT CONDITIONS PERSIST IN CALIFORNIA WITH NO END IN SIGHT! Snowfall, precipitation, and reservoir levels are below average, and the State Water Project water allocation was lowered to 5% of contract for the second year in a row. In response, Governor Newsom has declared a statewide Drought Emergency and has asked all Californians to reduce water use.

SCV WATER HAS SUPPLIES TO MEET DEMANDS, BUT NOT A DROP TO WASTE! While SCV Water has prepared for consecutive dry years by banking unused supplies during wet years, we are now accessing our critical dry year supplies to meet customer demands. Every gallon we conserve today is a gallon that we can depend on tomorrow.

WATER WASTE IS PROHIBITED AND IRRIGATION WATERING RESTRICTIONS ARE NOW IN EFFECT. To encourage water conservation and to help stretch our banked supplies, on April 26, 2022 the SCV Water Board of Directors enacted Stage 2 of our Water Shortage Contingency Plan (yourSCVwater.com/wscp) and Water Conservation and Water Supply Shortage Ordinance (bit.ly/SCVwaterShortageOrdinance).

PROHIBITED MEASURES

- · Water running off property (onto sidewalks, roads, parking lots, etc.)
- · Washing vehicles with a hose not equipped with a shut-off nozzle
- · Using potable water to wash down driveways and sidewalks
- · Using outdoor irrigation during and 48 hours following measurable rain
- Irrigating public turf medians with potable water

WATERING RESTRICTIONS

- · Water landscapes no more than 3 times per week
- · Water landscapes only between midnight to 9 a.m. and/or 8 p.m. to midnight (May through October) for no more than 5 minutes per irrigation zone and/or no more than 10 minutes total on designated watering days

VIOLATIONS & PENALTIES

SCV Water's conservation goals focus on education and engagement. We encourage customers to take immediate action to eliminate water waste and to reduce irrigation use to avoid penalties.

Violations of any of the prohibited actions could constitute a fine of up to a maximum of \$500 per day, per violation. The first violation is a warning. Future violations may initiate additional notices and fines.






