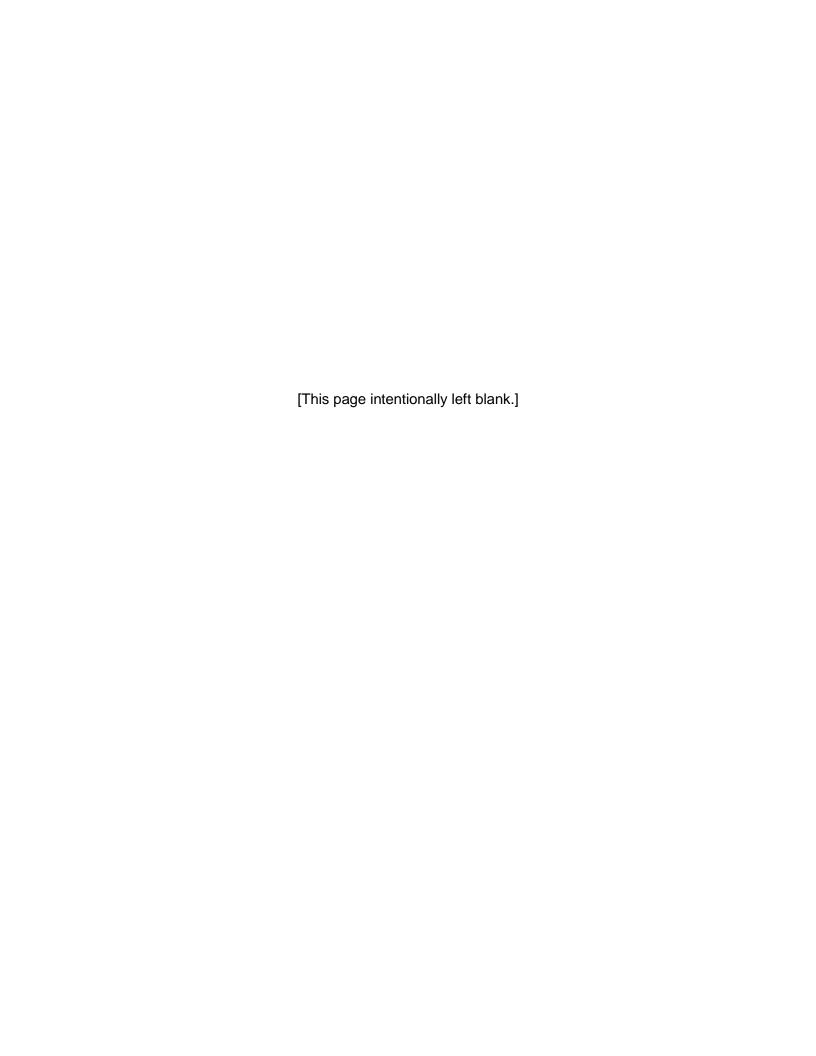

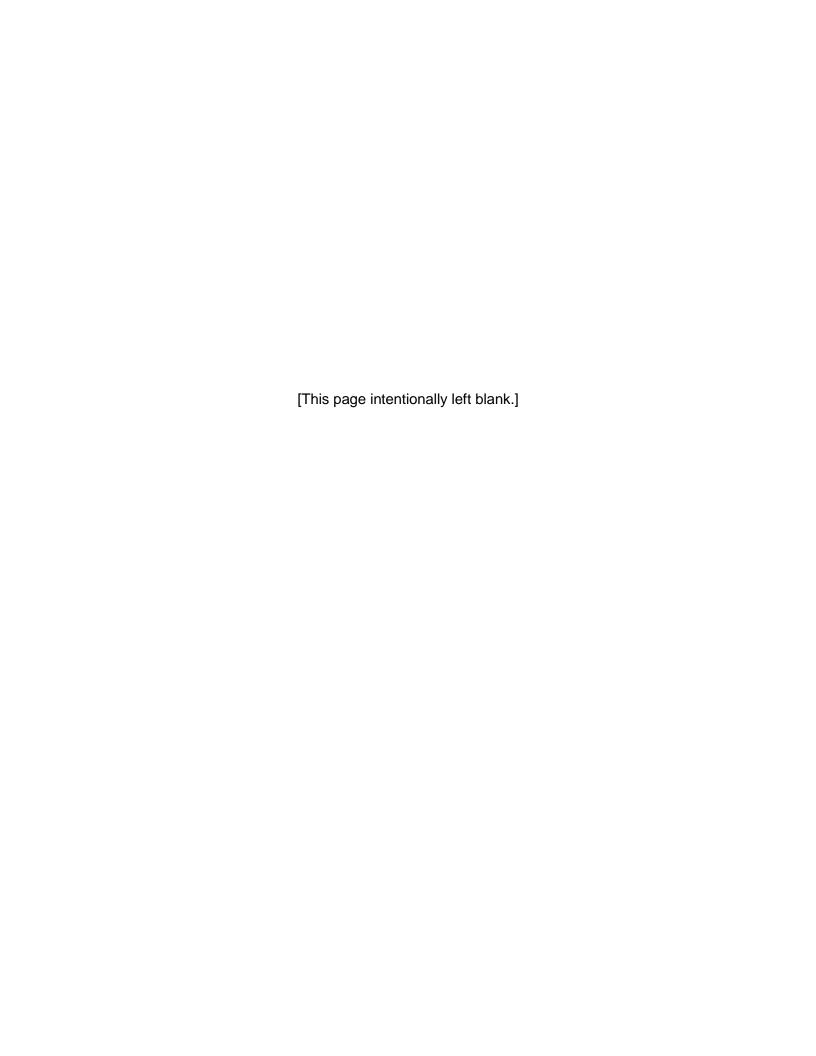

On November 29, 2021, I attended the ACWA JPIA Board of Directors Meeting at the Pasadena Convention Center in Pasadena, CA. The agenda for the meeting is attached.

#### Points of Interest:

- 1. The meeting was called to order by ACWA-JPIA Board President Jerry Gladbach.
- 2. The Board ratified two new members into the JPIA; Groundwater Banking Joint Powers Authority, and Bear Valley Basin Groundwater Sustainability Agency.
- 3. The Board approved a revision to the JPIA Governing Documents; in particular to the Bylaws in Article VIII, Section 1 and 2 regarding Nonclaim Disputes Definition and Procedure.
- 4. The Board approved changes to the Conflict of Interest Code, pending approval by the FPPC.
- 5. The Board approved a resolution honoring Thomas A. Cuquet for his 20 years of service to JPIA and its members.
- 6. The Board approved proposed changes to the JPIA Investment Policy.
- 7. The Board received updates from JPIA staff on the Pooled Programs, including the Liability Program, the Property Program, the Worker's Compensation Program, and the Employee Benefits Program. Highlights are as follows:
  - The Liability Program has had no increase in the last 15 years.
  - The Property Program will see a 15% increase in the coming year beginning July 1 due to recent catastrophic events.
  - The Workers Compensation Program pricing has been very stable and no changes in the rates for the current year.
  - The Employee Benefits Program will see a 5% reduction in rates for the self-funded PPO program.
- 8. The President's Special Recognition Award Recipients were announced. Recipients were members that have a loss rate 20% or less in either of the Liability, Property, or Workers Compensation Programs.
- 9. An update was received for the ACWA JPIA California Water Insurance Program, a Captive Insurance Company.
- 10. An update was provided on the training programs.
- 11. The ACWA JPIA Professional Development Program 2021 Graduates were recognized.
- 12. ACWA JPIA staff provided a Human Resources update.
- 13. Chief Executive Director Andy Sells provided a ]n update on current events at the JPIA.

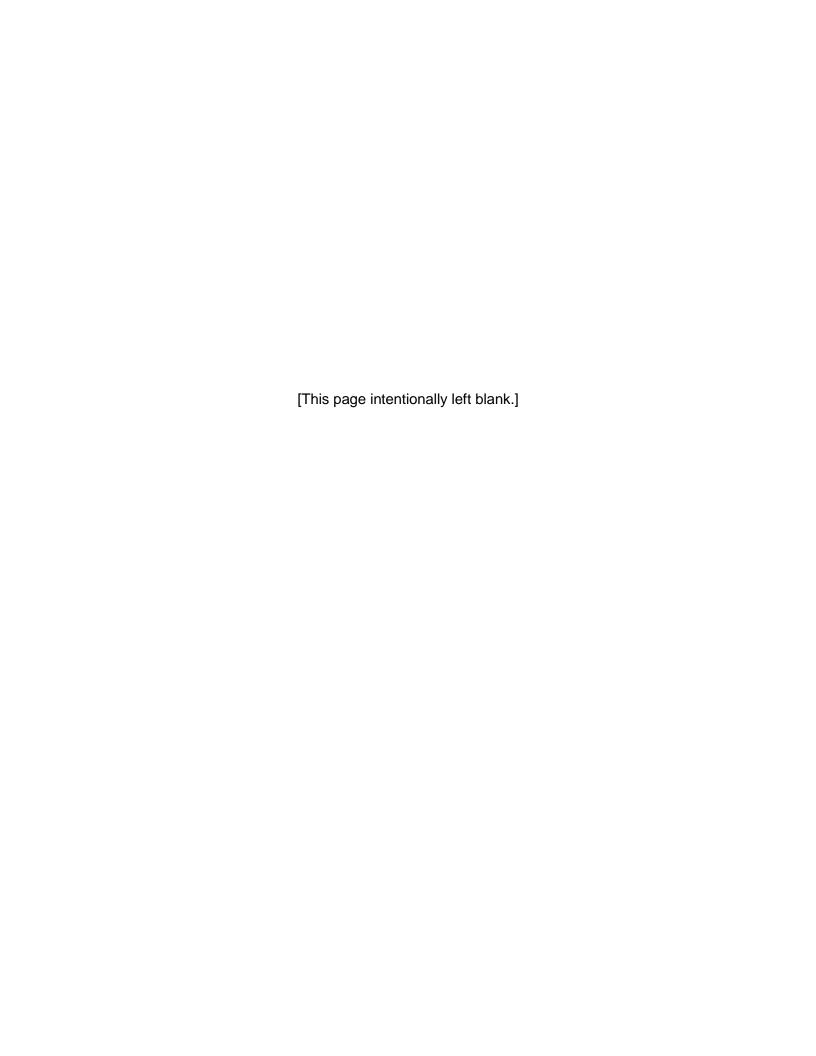



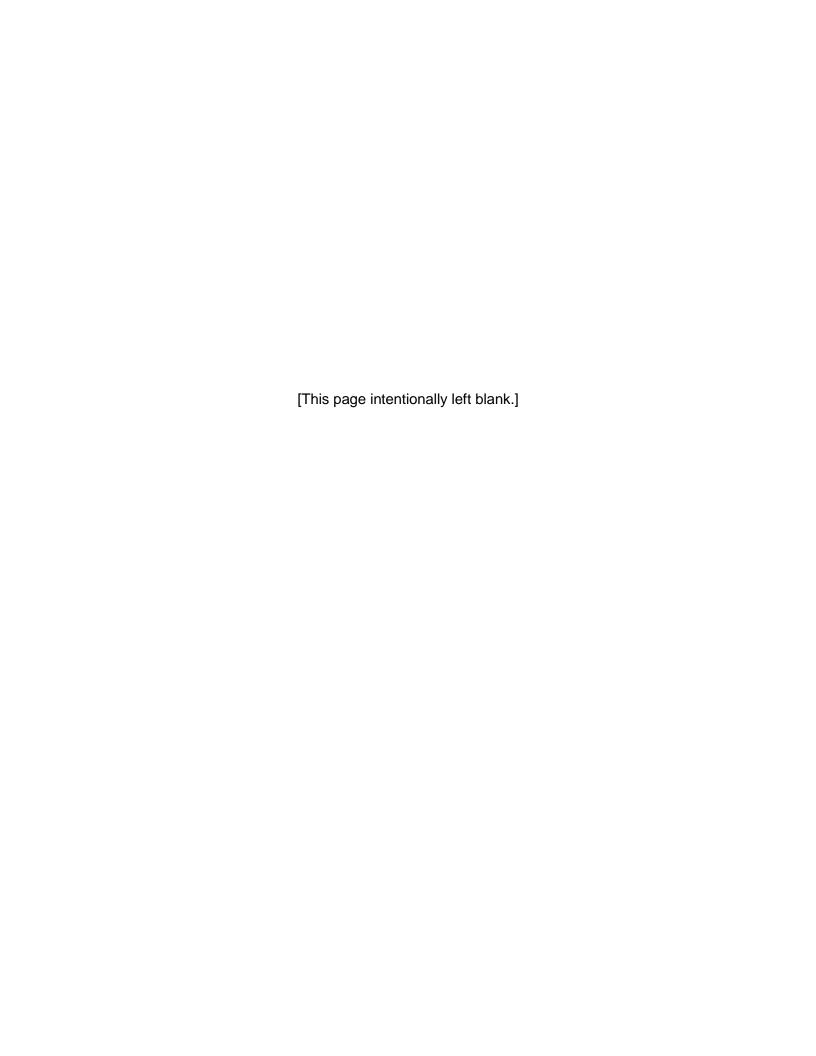

SCV Water Board meeting to be presented at: December 7, 2021

On November 29, 2021, I attended the ACWA Groundwater Committee meeting at the Pasadena Convention Center in Pasadena, CA. No agenda was provided.

#### Points of Interest:

- 1. The CA Department of Water Resources (DWR) provided a Sustainable Groundwater Act (SGMA) update, as presented by a series of speakers.
- 2. California's GW and CA/GW Live (bulletin 118); statewide report update was released with 2 new features: Regional GW at a glance, and CA's GW Live. The report includes current GW levels, current statistics, GW level changes at 1, 3, 5 and 10 years; GW level trend over the last 20 years, and Spring GW conditions.
- 3. A funding update was provided; \$300 million new funding over 3 years to fund GSP update activities, outreach and engagement, and project development. Round 1 opens in December 2021 and provides \$160 million for critically over-drafted basins (COD), Round 2 opens in late 2022 or early 2023, and provides \$205 million for non-COD basins.
- 4. The GSP timeline was presented; GSPs are due by 1/31/2022. The GSP evaluation being is underway with 6 plans approved and 6 others that will receive notification letters to consult on deficiencies, with 180 days to correct deficiencies.
- 5. A fast-paced presentation was made by the California Water Data Consortium. See cawaterdata.org for information on this item.
- 6. A presentation was made by the Groundwater Resources Association of California. The is their 30-year anniversary and they discussed their 2022 activities.
- 7. Cindy Tuck (ACWA) discussed state issues and new funding available for water infrastructure projects.
- 8. Dave Reynolds (ACWA) did the same on the Federal side and suggested that now is the time to be meeting with your regional field offices of their representatives to promote water project funding.

Ground Water Committee - 10AM

Steven Springhorn – Update on groundwater mapping and evaluation in the central valley – powerpoint available. They are making aerial overflights with the "big loop" to estimate ground water quantities. Keith Wallace – Gave an update on funding opportunities, especially for those needing funding in critical basins.

Melissa Sparks Kranz Drought update—DWR held listening sessions on drought, the developed principles which were released for public comment in September. 6 principals, 40 strategies to address drinking water during drought. They are now developing an implementation plan.

Melissa Shannon – SIGMA Regulation update. Adopted GSP must be submitted by Jan 31 and update report in April. Webinars about submittal process are available at the DWR SIGMA portal page. Craig Altare – GSP evaluation and assessment process, two approved, two had deficiencies and received notification letters. Recently 8 more were released, with 4 being approved and four notification letters. Notification letters are not final determinations – deficiencies can be addressed. Questions and answers included a discussion of subsidence which DWR is looking closely at. Mentioned that Cities Counties are supposed to take GSPs into consideration, but the bridges to make that happen isn't always taking place.

Natalie Stork – SWRCB SIGMA report Water board released two more letters to support DWRs work in specified basins – letters posted in portal.

Tara Morgan - Development of an open source water accounting system. This is used by Rosedale Rio Bravo, designated as critically over drafted. Christiana Babbit gave a demonstration of the platform. There is a demonstration site that anyone can log on to.

Subcommittee updates – announced the three sub committees that has been meeting monthly Cindy Tuck – state issues Obtaining infrastructure funding such as PFAS funding 180 mi, 200 mil infrastructure 50 mil for ground re-purposing. Three relevant programs at ACWA this week.

## Water Quality 3PM

Clean Water Subcommittees Mauricio, Jeremy Jugrais, Chris Anderson

Talked about the Steelhead listing has potential to affect a variety of projects ACWA has formed a working group of agencies in the region. CFW must submit evaluation of CESA petition to determine if it deserves listing. If they agree, full review could take a year during which time take would not be permitted. ACWA policy is supposed to be balanced, so all parties should be at the table. Letter already posted on CFW website. United worried about St Felicia Dam — no steelhead trout existed. Freeman diversion — dead fish was maybe a farm raised, but used it to force install of fish ladder. CESA has no language about including distinct population segments', so shouldn't allow southern species. Mauricio claims it will cut their water right in half. This is cindy claimed regulatory overreach? could go to other species. Encouraged to reach out to legislators.

State wetlands and riparian policy. – waters of the state broader reach than 404 permits. Longer times for issuance of WDR, more mitigation is being requested.

- Patrick Versluis reported on new PFAS regulation. Some concern that water agencies might be labeled polluters under CERCLA. ACWA submitted a comment letter on the draft PHGs. DDW is working with agencies throughout the state. May issue new monitoring orders in late 2022 and may be new notification levels for additional PFAS compounds.
- Cindy legislative updates Infrastructure funding, 650 million State drinking water funding prioritized for low income communities, multi benefit projects, recycling. ACWA is producing a matrix that will list out the different pots of money will be posted next week. Covid 19 arrearage debt, the state appropriated 980 million, draft guidelines already produced. IRS that money is not part of the customers income, no 1099s needed. Must apply by Dec. 6<sup>th</sup>.
- Leslie Dobalian microplastic update- trying coordinate a definition for ocean and drinking water Hexevalent Chromium Steve Bigley Nov 4 released review for scoping on an EIR. Hopefully be certified next summer so that rule could be implemented in 2023. ACWA feels the issue was not properly noticed and there should be a finite project to comment on. Looking at ion exchange and reverse osmosis, evaluating 17 different scenarios. Must be economically and technically feasible.
