

**SUBJECT:** Update on Conservation Activities and Performance

#### SUMMARY AND DISCUSSION

#### **Status of Conservation Projects**

#### Online Customer Engagement and Program Management Portal

SCV Water offers many water conservation and water use efficiency programs including, but not limited to, rebates and incentives for removing and replacing water-thirsty turfgrass, upgrading to a smart irrigation controller, and installing high-efficiency irrigation equipment (HE Nozzles, Master Pressure Regulation, Pressure Regulating Bodies). To support customer engagement and manage various rebate requests, SCV Water employs an online customer engagement portal via consultant Droplet Technologies (https://yourscvwater.dropletprograms.com/). Since 2019, staff and Droplet have worked vigorously to update the legacy system to include additional programs, processes, and procedures. In July 2021, the new customer engagement portal launched, and staff continues to work the consultant to ensure optimal customer interaction and useability.

#### Department of Water Resources – CII Performance Standards

In advance of implementation of the Conservation Long-term Framework (AB 1668 and SB 606), the Department of Water Resources (DWR) organized several workgroups to evaluate and develop the various components, methodologies, and standards of the annual Urban Water Use Objectives (UWUO). The UWUOs are comprised of the Indoor Residential Objective, the Outdoor Residential Objective, the Commercial Outdoor Objective, and a Water Loss Objective. While Commercial, Industrial, and Institutional (CII) use is excluded from the UWUO, urban water suppliers are required to develop Best Management Practices (BMP) and programs to support CII water use efficiency efforts. During its July 2021 meeting, the CII Workgroup discussed approaches to classifying and categorizing CII water use to develop baseline, benchmarking, and reporting processes. Currently, the workgroup is considering a phased approach to include Commercial, Industrial, Institutional, and Dedicated Irrigation Meters for a period of four years followed by a more robust classification system based on findings and recommendations from Phase 1 implementation. The Conservation Long-term Framework compliance period begins on July 1, 2023 with the first annual report due on January 1, 2024.

### **Status of Sustainability Projects**

#### Sustainability & Climate Action Plan

In April 2021, SCV Water procured support from Rincon Consultants, Inc. to develop the Sustainability and Climate Action Plan (S&CAP). The first component of the analysis and planning effort includes collecting data on historical electric, natural gas, and water use, fleet inventory and fuel costs, employee commute estimates, solar production, construction project emissions, and other agency-specific metrics. In July 2021, staff finalized data collection and has submitted it to the consultant for its initial sustainability analysis. Following completion of the initial analysis, staff will develop educational materials and formats to elicit feedback from the executive management team, Board of Directors, and from the public.

#### **Status of Special Projects**

#### Purple PREP – Recycled Water Customer Conversions

Staff continues to work with end-use customers in the Phase 2B and 2D project areas to convert existing irrigation to recycled water. In July 2021, staff provided conversion plans for review and Purple PREP documentation for application purposes to Phase 2D customers. Staff is currently scheduling similar meetings with Phase 2B customers. The site conversion plan and Purple PREP review meetings are scheduled to conclude in September/October 2021.

#### Local Watershed & Aquifers Exhibit Project Launch




Figure 1 - Local Watershed and Aquifers Exhibit Concept

SCV Water staff continue to work with consultant Bowman Change to develop the Local Watershed and Aquifers Exhibit. The current concept intends to demonstrate the local watershed and aguifers by raising a cross-section of the Santa Clarita Valley (shown in Figure 1). Teachers and students will be able to identify their location using surface maps and associated landmarks and will have a "3D" view into the Alluvium and Saugus Aguifers. Additionally, the exhibit will demonstrate, among other things, direction of subsurface water flow, groundwater wells, well depth, and watershed-aguifers interaction. Education components will focus on the value of groundwater to our community, water conservation and water use efficiency practices, and groundwater sustainability.

### **Bridgeport Pocket Park**




Figure 2 - Bridgeport Pocket Park Design Concept

In July 2021, staff finalized design documents for the Bridgeport Pocket Park and have submitted the document package to the City of Santa Clarita (City) for review and feedback. Staff anticipates receiving feedback from the City in August/September. Once received, staff will incorporate feedback into the design plans and prepare and implement the Request for Proposal (RFP) process. The RFP process is scheduled for Fall 2021.
