- 3. Provide opportunities for the public to learn about the process and provide input consistent with SCV Water's commitment to transparency.






Establishing a Baseline: SCV Water GHG Inventory



- Using GHG emissions as a metric allows operations across SCVWA's sectors to be compared
- Helps identify areas with greatest impact from sustainability measure implementation

Planning for the Future: SCV Water Forecast



- Forecasting future operations allows for improved sustainability planning
- GHG emissions as metric allows continued comparison across SCVWA operational sectors and allows for State legislative Sustainability measures to be accounted for (e.g., Senate Bill 100)

Sustainability Strategy Development

Goals

 Aspirational statements regarding future achievement goals for key sectors



Measures

 Long-range policies developed to achieve specific sustainability goals (i.e., energy resiliency, energy efficiency, resource management)



Actions

 Specific programs or steps that support sustainability measures

Funding Opportunities linked to Sustainability Planning (with GHG Emissions as a KPI)

- The 2022-23 Governor's Budget
 - \$2.3 Billion to the California Air Resourced Board (CARB) for statewide greenhouse gas reduction
 - \$810 million to CA Energy Commission (CEC) to accelerate progress on the state's clean energy goals
- Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Implementation Grant Program
 - \$192 million for awards in Round 2 funding
 - Eligible projects must include adopting IRWM Plan that addresses "climate change" impacts
- State Water Board Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF)
 - Finances projects from \$1 \$100 million
 - Projects receive extra points if applicants have adopted a "climate change" action plan or policy

Sustainability - SCV Water Strategic Plan

- Strategy C.6 Actively manage natural resource use.
- C.6.1 Conduct organization-wide energy assessment to identify opportunities to reduce energy use
- C.6.2 Evaluate SCV Water's solar power contracts and options to optimize the cost and value to SCV Water
- C.6.3 Optimize facility operations to minimize power, supplies, chemicals, and labor consumption
- C.6.4 Assess the carbon footprint of SCV Water
- C.6.5 Develop/implement appropriate emissions reductions
